UNDERSTANDING GOD'S COMMAND

*The Fruit of Self-Control*

*What it is:*

**Self-Control** is the ability to control one's emotions, words, and actions so that they're in harmony with God's will.

*Ways we fail to bear this fruit:*

We become mastered by our emotions: "the evil in our desires often lies not in what we want but in the fact that we want it too much." (David Powlison)

We have untamed tongues: "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up" (Eph 4:29)

We have misguided members: "Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present...your members to God as instruments for righteousness." (Rom 6:13)

CORPORATE PRAYER OF CONFESSION

*James 4:1; Eph 4:29; Ps 141:3; Mt. 22:36-40*

Heavenly Father,

Forgive us for not having control over our emotions. We have been motivated by our own selfish desires rather than godly ones.
