How does God call us as the Church to live in relationship with one another?

Do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count one another more significant than yourselves.*

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.

Twin Killers of True Community:

Selfish-Ambition: *when our aim is personal gain rather than self-denying service.*

Conceit (Pride): *you cannot get down to wash feet if you are too busy standing up and looking down on them.*

Essential Ingredient of True Community:

Humility: *"humility is not thinking less of yourself but thinking of yourself less."* (C.S. Lewis)


