The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated during our Corporate Worship Service. This is not a Presbyterian table, and we do not restrict it as such—it is the Lord's Table. However, the elders of the church have been tasked with ensuring that this meal is partaken of in a worthy manner (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore if you do not embrace Christ as your Lord and Savior; if you are living in unrepentant willful defiance of Christ's commands; or if you are not a member in good standing at an evangelical church; we kindly ask that you refrain from participating in this meal. Instead, we invite you to remain among us and use this time to reflect on the person and work of Christ and what it means to embrace Him as Savior and Lord. If you have any questions about our practice of the Lord's Supper please feel free to direct them to the Pastor.
